- Members agreed that it is important to frame how choices are required/prioritisation of commitments.
- Members also discussed the need to grow capacity in public and private sector, the need to bring in the national training fund, and link with lifelong learning agenda.
- It was noted that the impact of inflation should be reflected, and suggested that some of labour market constraints should stay in this Chapter.
- Members also highlighted the need for driving MMC in the Construction sector.

Chapter 6 - Members Comments

- Members highlighted that security of supply, competitiveness and green sources are key areas of focus. Including harnessing of wind.
