109.1 Chair's Introduction, Minutes & Matter Arising		
The Chair opened the meeting.		
The minutes from NCPC meeting 108 were approved.		
<ul> <li>David Hegarty provided an update on the progress of the Department of Enterprise, Trade and Employment's new White Paper on Ireland's enterprise policy.</li> </ul>		
The Chair updated on the NCPC's invitation to participate in the EU's Technical Support Instrument. This will involve working with the OECD looking at "Strengthening pro-productivity policies through enhanced NPBs capabilities and performance". The French coordinators have also invited Germany, Finland and Portugal to participate. Each country must apply for funding using a common template and the EU closing date is the 31st October 2022. A further update on this project will be given at the December Council meeting.

<ul> <li>Liaise with the research service in the Oireachtas</li> </ul>		
<ul> <li>Work to spread NCPC message to schools and universities through engagement</li> </ul>		



## 109.3 Productivity Discussion

- This agenda item featured two presentations on productivity:
  - First, Sean O'Boyle presented on the CSO work on productivity statistics.
  - Then, Martina Lawless presented on ESRI Productivity Research.
- Members noted the importance of gaining insight into the differing productivity levels across the foreign vs domestic firms.

# 109.4 Work Plans Q4 2022

- The Chair stated that the objective of this agenda item is to discuss with the Council the Work Plan options for the remainder of 2022.
- The proposed Bulletin topics for remainder of 2022 are:
  - o Climate Action Plan Targets for the Enterprise Sector
  - Competitiveness perspective on upcoming policy developments: White Paper on Enterprise and/or a Living Wage
  - o Constraints on Indicators
  - National Claims Information Database (NCID)
- Dermot Coates noted that it was likely that only one further Bulletin would be completed this year. He also raised the prospect of a future paper (in 2023) on the Carrying Capacity of the State which would further develop a theme addressed in the Competitiveness Challenge report.
- The Secretariat will aim to further progress analysis and update at the next meeting of the Council.
- The planning for Ireland's Competitiveness Scorecard 2023 was discussed.
  - The question for the Council is: 'Are they happy with the publication schedule and the remaining topics?
  - The question for the Council is: 'is the approach used in the 2020 Competitiveness Scorecard still fit for purpose?

### **Members Comments**

- Members were broadly in favour of the upcoming schedule, and some expressed the view that the Carrying Capacity paper should be a priority going forward.
- One member noted that NCPC Bulletins could be a useful tool to benchmark Ireland's performance in comparison to other similar EU countries.



	Members noted that it is too early in the process to do a Bulletin on the NCID data or a Living Wage.
